What is the problem?

- According to the Electricity and Natural Gas Act, Law no. 123/2012, the electricity wholesale market transactions are:
 - **▶** Public
 - ► Non-dicriminative
 - ▶ Transparent
 - **▶** Centralized
- PPA or any bilaterally negociated wholesale contracts are forbidden

What we have done already?

- ► Regulation (EU) 2019/943 of the European Parliament and of the Council on the internal market for electricity - long-term electricity supply contracts shall be negotiable over the counter
- ► ANRE order no. 236/2019 transposes the provisions of Regulation 943 referring to long term wholesale contracts
 - ▶ Long term contracts are permited on non-regulated markets
 - ▶ Price formation based only on demand and supply
 - Acces of consumers to the electricity markets (including balancing market)
 - ► Aggregation (consumption, production)

What to expect?

- New balancing rules to be approved by ANRE (aggregation, single price, 15 min. settlement period, voluntary market, DSR)
- Definition of long-term contracts
- ▶ PPA trading platform for OPCOM
- Allowing flexible bilateral contracts on OPCOM (quantities and prices)
- ► New market and tariff rules for storage???
